PALATKA.

[THE GEM CITY.]

PALATKA was settled in 1821. The earliest settlement of which there seems to be any record was made by James Marver, —Hines, and —Woodruff, who in that year purchased Spanish grants and established a trading post on the banks, where they subsequently did a large business with the Indians. According to Marver, the name Palatka signifies "over-look" and was applied to the town or settlement on account of its being a favorite spot among the Indians for canoeing from this to Hart's Point, on the opposite side of the river.

The trading-post was located at the foot of Main street not far from where the Florida Southern Railway depot now stands. Some years later the post and lands passed into the hands of Dr. S. Brush, of New York, his two nephews, Thomas and William Brush, conducting the "post" and maintaining the Indian trade until the breaking out of the Seminole War, when it was burned, the proprietors escaping down the river after great hardships and peril. Soon after the United States Government established here a military station, in command of General Worth, his headquarters being located near or about where the mansion of Col. Hart now stands, according to the late Col. Devall. During this period (Seminole War) the place was wholly military. A large hospital occupied the site of Col. Hart's mansion, and the site of the new Burnham House was a military stable with quarters for 400 horses. The most interesting feature, however, was the block-houses. These were eight in number, 50 by 100 feet in dimensions, and constructed of heavy timbers and plank. Upon top of one of these block-houses was erected a lookout 80 feet high, commanding an extensive view of the surrounding country and enabling the people to discover the approach of Indians. The houses were mostly located on Water street. A large blacksmith shop was also located here. In 1855 a fire destroyed five of the houses, and the rest have gradually disappeared. On Saturday, Nov. 8th, 1884, a severe conflagration destroyed all the larger hotels, and the business center of Palatka. This fire proved to be a blessing in disguise, for Phoenix like new brick blocks and hotels have arisen on the ashes of the old, and to-day, in spite of disaster, Palatka stands third in the list of the galaxy of enterprising cities in East and South Florida.

Many of the great military men were at one time here, and some who are now prominent first gained their experience in the Seminole War. Generals Scott, Taylor, and Gaines once had their headquarters here. General Sherman was located here as lieutenant, also General Cassy. The two last mentioned, in a recent visit, recognized several old landmarks despite the great improvements since made.

Palatka today has a population of 3,848. It is located on the west bank of the St. Johns, 75 miles by the windings of the river and 56 miles by rail south of Jacksonville, and 50 east of Gainesville. The city is built on a fine elevation, the slope to the river affording natural wharfing for

the numerous steam and sailing craft which furnish several railways abundant transportation facilities. The streets are regularly laid out, and both in the business and residence quarters lined with orange trees loaded with fruit or fragrant blossoms. During the season large shipments of oranges are made from this point. A dozen steamers stop at the wharves during the day, and the Jacksonville, Tampa and Key West Railway affords rapid communication with Jacksonville and Sanford, to which latter named city this road has recently been completed. The business houses are large and well fitted up, the churches and halls spacious, and the residences many of them surrounded by beautiful grounds.

The Florida Southern Railway runs to Gainesville and Ocala, and the line has recently been extended to Pemberton Ferry, where it connects with the South Florida Railroad, forming a through line to Tampa, and also a branch on to Brooksville, to which trains are now running. The road is rapidly being extended on down the peninsula to Charlotte Harbor. Ocean steamers run to Charleston, S. C., at regular intervals.

Another railroad, the St. Augustine & Palatka Railway, is now nearly completed, forming an air line road between Palatka and St. Augustine. It runs from Sunny Point, a fine bluff with deep water directly opposite Palatka, 24 miles to a point on the St. Johns Railway of Florida about six miles west of St. Augustine. It is standard gauge and will add another laurel to Palatka's well won wreath. It has been said that "it is the unexpected that happens," so it is possible that St. Augustine, with its seventeen feet of water at high tide may after all, with this connecting link of railroad, be the seaport for Palatka. The central office for this road is in the Astor Block, Jacksonville, Florida, and Major Richard McLaughlin is President of the company which owns it.

Since the conflagration in 1884, Palatka has been deprived of the hotel facilities which it deserved. In addition to the Graham, the Carleton and The Saratoga, which were not destroyed at that time, there has been recently erected the Phoenix Hotel, a brick structure, situated in the business center and now open. It has been reserved for the enterprise of the people of Palatka to erect a hotel which is the wonder of every stranger who arrives there. It is built on the site of the old Putnam House, which name it retains, and occupies a whole square. It is 234 feet in front with an L 281 feet long, three stories in height. There is another L 181 feet in length. The dining room is 120x42 feet and open wood fire places are in all the public rooms and many of the parlors and chambers. There are elevators, steam heat, electric lights, billiard halls, artesian wells hot and cold water, sulphur and other baths, a tropical garden in the interior court around which the hotel is built and where fountains lend an enchantment to the scene. Not content with this vast expense, another addition is to be built during the summer of 1886, which will add 250 rooms to the capacity of the hotel, making in all 500 sleeping apartments in this elegant caravansary. New gas works are now in operation and Palatka has fully recovered from what at first seemed a disaster, but has resulted in a blessing. To see Palatka at its best one should arrive there of a pleasant afternoon, and be impressed with its well-kept streets, with orange trees on either side, under which are seen the promenaders from the North, or lounging on the spacious piazzas of the hotels. As twilight steals on, electric lights illuminate the surroundings, and, with music in the air floating from the parlors of the hotels, the scene is suggestive of life in Italy, and directly in contrast with the frozen North.




